Montrose Cemetery – Layout (see map below)

Squares – The Cemetery is divided into eleven major areas - <u>Squares</u>: (A,B,C,D,E,F,G,H,J,K,O) (alpha)

Blocks – The Squares are broken down into several <u>Blocks</u> each as needed (4 – 24, numeric)

Units - These Blocks are further divided into smaller <u>Units</u> (up to four; A,B,C,D, *alpha*)

Grave Space – Within the Units are the <u>Grave Spaces</u> (typically 1-8, *num*eric)

Square-Block-Unit-Grave designation of a specific grave location

<u>Example</u> of a *specific grave space* (even if unused): <u>Square H-Block 2-Unit A-Grave 001</u> (H-2-A-1), which is the legal location description.

Special note: In the "**O**" old square – the southwest quarter of the nine acres - the layout is not as evenly divided, but it does conform to the numbering convention. (Except that grave space numbers are typically up to three digits)

Top of this map is Sibley Street (north)



Each **Square** is outlined in red.

Note: A typical **Block** includes 32 grave spaces.

There are 4" x 6" white granite **posts** about 7" tall marking the *corners* of each **Square**.

The letter identifying that Square is engraved as a large letter on the top of the post, i.e. **H**



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There are also granite **circles** 6" in diameter flush with the ground in the *center* of each **Block**.

They are engraved with the Block designation, i.e. H-2
